As I write this first newsletter of the academic year, I realize it is the last day of the 5th week of school. I'm not sure where the time went, but I suppose the time is flying by because we, as members of an unsettled society, have many things that we are continuing to deal with, including the complexities of how to offer a safe school experience amidst all that is happening. That said, we are mostly satisfied with the energy our students are bringing into the school each day. It seems clear that most of our students are glad to be back and appreciate the chance to attend in-person learning as opposed to the distance learning mode we were forced into over portions of the last two years. That said, I need to ask parents to be a partner to the school by reinforcing a few key core values with your children so that they come to the school mentally and physically ready for the challenges and learning opportunities they will be given by our teaching staff each day.

First, we ask that parents help to ensure that your children have the structure in place that allows them to be well-rested each day before coming to school. Students who get 8 hours or more of sleep each night will be sufficiently rested enough to come to school with the energy, alertness and focus needed to be successful in class each hour and each day.

Next, we ask that parents continue to work with their children about boundaries and civility, simply meaning that school exists for a purpose; which is to assist our young people in acquiring knowledge and skills necessary for adult life. In order to achieve that goal, we need our students to come to school ready and willing to be courteous to those around them, and also to be respectful of the property of the school and of their peers.

Finally, we ask parents to guide their children to understand that getting an education is not really a privilege or even a choice, it is much more a civic duty or responsibility. Public schools are put in place by the government to ensure that our young people will eventually acquire the fundamental knowledge and skills needed to become productive members of the workforce. It is through the workforce that our society continues to be self-sustaining and prosperous. It seems that, for some, school is incidental or maybe even annoying. We will do better to help our children and students understand that the key to our success as people and as a nation is that we all do our part and make our contributions where we can. For kids, that means going to school and being appropriately engaged. For adults, it

means going to work, earning our way, and contributing to our community as producers. School is at the foundation of that. It is vitally important that we continue to instill the value of education in our youth. Let's help them to understand that they are responsible to come to school each day with a spirit of cooperation, an attitude of courtesy and respect, and a willingness to try to do the work that our teachers present to them each day to the best of their ability. If we can agree on those key core values,

we will get back to a more "normal" state sooner rather than later.

Bus Update

I have recently sent two messages home outlining the school bus issues and how the upcoming changes may impact our families. If you missed those messages, this should be of some help. The transportation department is currently working on the revised routing for the entire dis-

trict, which includes New Heights School. The rerouting, which was originally set to take place on October 4th, has been postponed until November 3rd-which means that the current level of busing should remain intact until November 3rd. We understand that the first priority is to re-route families who live 2.0 miles from school or more on buses beginning on

November 3rd. As this re-routing takes place, the routers will attempt to continue to add students to routes who live inside of the 2.0 mile boundary as long as there is space on the buses- we anticipate there will be space for more students. That does not guarantee that all families who currently have busing to and from school will still get bused, but it does mean that the routers are going to make every effort to run buses at capacity and they are hopeful that they will be able

to continue to offer busing to all of our currently bused families, even after November 3rd. We expect that the transportation department will be sending information to families on or around October 27th, so please be watching for your family's updated route information later this month. If you are confused, call the school and we will try to assist you.

These are complicated times. When things don't seem to make sense, please try to have patience and remain calm. You

can always call the school for clarification. We will do our best to guide you.

I volunteered in a special education program during high school and really enjoyed it! There wasn't one specific event that inspired me, it's just something


I've always wanted to do :-)


