Attendance Reporting

We have created a new path for parents who wish to report an absence, either before or after the fact. You can now email your child's attendance status to this email address: attendance@newheightsschool.org. This general email will get picked up by several staff members to ensure that we are recording absences accurately. Parents can still phone the absences as well, but some parents will appreciate this method. Parents can also add attachments to the emails, such as doctor's notes or other documents that might be helpful in understanding the nature of a child's absence.

School-Related Items

Here is a reminder to parents to check with your children and remind them to not bring items to school that have no school-related value. This may be referring to video games, personal computers, toys and games, stuffed animals, eccentric costumes, or other distracting items that may distract your child or other students from the true business of the school, which is teaching and learning. We also want to remind families that breakfast and lunch (meals) are important, but coming to late to school because the lines were long at McDonald's and Starbucks is not a valid reason to come to school late, and students are not permitted to have those items in class anyways. If those things are an important component to starting the school day, let's plan ahead and leave plenty of time to get through the lines without distracting others at school in class with coffees and bags of food. These items have not been allowed at school for many years, but have started creeping their way back in post pandemic. We are trying to get the feel of school to a "back to normal" place and will appreciate your understanding on this topic.
