

The following is a list of student assessments currently **required by the state**:

MCA:

- **MCA Reading** will be administered to 3rd- 8th grades and 10th and will occur for the 6th-8th and 10th grade on March 12-13 2024.
- **MCA Reading** for grades 3-5 will be administered on April 23-24, 2024
- **MCA Math** will be administered to 3-5 on April 9-10, 2024
- **MCA Math** grades 6-8 and 11 will be administered on April 16-17, 2024

MCA Science for grades 5, 8 and all students currently enrolled in **Biology** will be administered on April 30th and May 1st, 2024.

The duration for each MCA testing session will be scheduled for **60 minutes** per.

Local assessments administered by the school include: Fastbridge A Reading, A Math and “mySAEBRS”

The scheduled dates are as follows:

- **A Math** for K-5 is September 5th, January 9th and May 7th
- **A Reading** for K-5 is September 6, January 10th and May 8th
- **A Math** for 6-12 is September 19th, February 20th, and May 14th
- **A Reading** for 6-12 is September 20, February 21st, and May 15th

Each testing session is scheduled for one class period, which is **55 minutes** per

“**mySAEBRS**” will be administered to all students in grades 6-12 on Sept 20th, Feb. 21st and May 15th. The scheduled duration of mySAEBRS is **15 minutes**. mySAEBRS is used to determine social and emotional concerns of students.

The following is a list of when Fastbridge and MCA test results will be available and how they will be used:

MCA results reports will become available to school staff in **late August** of each year. Results will be sent to parents shortly thereafter. Results are used by school staff to measure present levels of performance, assess growth of students annually, and may be used with other data points for course and or level placement.

Fastbridge is available immediately after the test administration is complete and is generally used to measure and monitor academic progress in reading fluency, comprehension and math performance from year to year, but also as data points throughout a given year. The scores can also be used by teachers and counselors for reading and math level placement, as well as a tool to use when conferencing with parents about academic performance at a point in time.
