

New Heights' goal is to inspire students to value continuous learning in all aspects of their lives, including actively seeking out opportunities for personal growth and professional adaptability with a focus on emerging trends and technologies. This is a hard goal to quantify because it will be based on what efforts the school has made toward assisting the students to be active, life-long learners, but can't be analyzed until the students demonstrate that they are/were life-long learners. So, solidly built into the curriculum are the following aspects: • Teaching students to use problem solving skills and critical thinking strategies; • Helping students to develop a curiosity and love for learning new material; • Taking ownership for their own learning as well as teaching them how to become self-directed learners; • And promoting the concept of having a growth mindset, simply meaning that our students will ideally understand that they do not have a fixed set of skills and talents, but that each of them if capable of improvement over time, even in areas that have been difficult throughout their school careers. (This is perhaps the strongest area of focus, helping them to know they can learn difficult material and overcome obstacle with some perseverance.
