### **Attendance**

First, let's remind everyone that success in school begins with attendance. Although the pandemic has created a different and almost opposite way of doing things, school systems are trying to get students back to a more "normal" approach when it comes to school attendance. Strong attendance in school pays huge dividends and poor attendance in school most often causes problems that could potentially spill over into other key areas of life like school performance and future employment

habits. When our students attend school at a rate of 90% or higher, they learn more, get their assignments done at a higher level and get them turned in on time with a higher degree of accuracy-all equating to better academic performance and better grades. This, in turn, can and should directly lead to more success in other areas of life. School is the



training ground for the world of work, which all of our students are expected to participate in as adults. The habits they form in their brains today can and often do have an impact on their adult lives. Treating school as unimportant or incidental will likely lead to treating work as unimportant or incidental. Students who don't attend school regularly learn less, find school frustrating and will likely perform poorly on school work and tests and the result will likely be failing grades and low self-esteem. Adults who frequently miss work don't get their assigned tasks done, get poor performance reports and will likely lose their jobs, also known as getting fired. So, you can see that we in education believe there is most often a direct correlation between attitude, effort and performance in school with future

attitude, effort and performance in the workplace. Let's work together to give our students the best chance of success as adults by starting them off on the right foot as students by attending school at a high rate.



### **School Closures**

School Closures for weather-related reasons Just a reminder that school could close as a

result of weather conditions that make safe travel to and from school difficult or even impossible. New Heights partners with Stillwater School District for student transportation bus service, so when Stillwater District Schools close school due to weather conditions, New Heights will also close, however, we do ask that parents try to be patient until we send out the official notice from the school before absolutely concluding that New Heights is closing too. Once we know that Stillwater made a decision to close, we will first notify our staff, then we will send an official notice to at least one parent of all students enrolled at New Heights via text message. We will also post our status on television channels 4,5, 9 and 11, and we will post our status for the day on the school's website and



Facebook page. Remember that when the school does remain open during a questionable weather event, parents should still make the decision that best fits your circumstances and comfort level regarding sending your child to school. Your decision will not be questioned when there is an obvious dilemma due to weather.

engagement at school. At New Heights, we talk about the 4 B's; Be Present, Be Engaged, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible. The top portion of this letter was dedicated to the "Be Present" aspect of school, which relates to attendance. The next thing we need from our students aside from being at school is to be engaged in learning activities. Being engaged means to get actively involved in the school process. Being engaged means once you get to class, you separate yourself from people and things that can distract you from paying attention and doing your work. To be engaged means to actively listen, ask questions when confused or when you need clarification on a particular point. Being engaged means participating in class discussions or being an active member of a small group on assigned work. Being engaged means monitoring your grades and making sure you have not only completed an assignment, but that you turned it into the teacher in the format he or she expects. You can easily see that although we place a high value on being here at school, we place an equal emphasis on the actions a student should be taking aside from simply being here. Imagine having employees at work who show up, but do absolutely nothing. It is important that our students not only show up every day, but that they also become actively involved in their own education by doing the things mentioned above.

Now that you have a heightened level of awareness of what is expected of our students with regard to attendance and engagement, perhaps you could visit with your child and ask them how they feel they are doing when it comes to attending school on time each day and also about their beliefs regarding their level of engagement at school. We have frequent communication with our students about attendance and engagement, but it might prove to be beneficial to have our parents supporting these concepts with them at home as well. 
